Assessment Focus 3:

To deduce, infer or interpret information, events or ideas from texts, read between the lines:-

- Uses knowledge of a story so far to make predictions so about what will happen next
- Connects information together to draw out implied meanings
- Distinguishes between more/ less important items of information
- Uses clues from what characters do and say to explain their motives

Dear Mr Bargh

On behalf of everyone at Centrepoint Outreach I am writing to thank you for the generous donation of harvest food from *New York Primary School*. Please pass on our thanks to everyone who contributed.

Although we have not been able to hold our usual drop in sessions due to social distancing toquirements, we have continued to provide food parcels to people who are either referred to us by agencies such as Children's Services or who refer themselves, many of whom are struggling to survive on low incomes. Since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic we have provided over 350 food parcels in response to such referrals.

At the start of lockdown 18 rough sleepers were accommodated on a temporary basis in a local hotel and since that time we have provided over 2500 daily breakfasts to the individuals remaining in the hotel. In addition, since May we have also provided over 300 food parcels for the residents in the hotel on a Sunday when there is no other food provision

The food help we have been providing has substantially depleted our stocks and we have, at times, had to resort to buying food, something we do not usually have to do. We are therefore so gruteful to you for your support this harvest which will help to keep up with demand.
