How many toes?

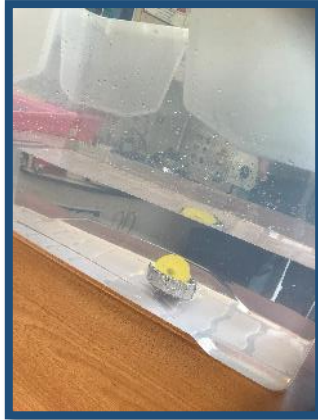
8 2D Shape Hunt

Count how many handles are in your house. Look for doors, cupboards, windows etc. How many did you find?

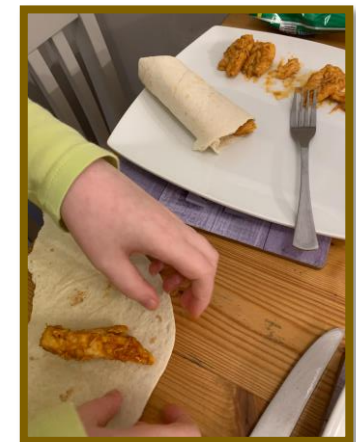
10 Maths on the Move number trail
