A New Term:

We have another tremendously busy term ahead...

<u>Class 1:</u>

This term class 1 will be learning all about Amelia Earhart, with a focus on Geography...Where did she travel? What difficulties did she face with the weather? How did this impact on her disappearance? On behalf of everyone at Centrepoint Outreach I am writing to thank you for the recent donation of harvest food from *New York Primary School*. I should be grateful if you would pass on our thanks to everyone who donated so generously notwithstanding the current pressures on household budgets.

As well as providing food parcels to people who are struggling to afford to feed themselves and their families, we also use donated food to provide daily hot snacks for homeless and vulnerable people visiting our morning drop in support and advice sessions.

You may be interested to know that during September 2022 we helped 55 people who were homeless or in temporary accommodation and we provided food, furniture, household items, clothing and bedding on 591 occasions to those most in need. In addition to this, our staff dealt with 312 enquiries and we received 469 visits to our drop in sessions.

Thank you once again for your generous donation which will help to restock our shelves to ensure that we can continue to support those who come to us in need.

The Firework Code

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- Light them at arm's length, using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit.
 Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
